India-Estonia Bilateral Relations

India first recognised Estonia on 22 September, 1921 when Estonia was admitted into the League of Nations. India re-recognised the Republic of Estonia on 9 September 1991, a month after it declared its independence from the Soviet Union. Diplomatic relations were established on 2 December 1991. Bilateral relations are cordial and friendly. Since 1991, Embassy of India, Helsinki (Finland) was concurrently accredited to Estonia. The Embassy of India in Tallinn was opened on 28 December, 2021 headed by a Cd'A a.i. The first resident Ambassador presented his credentials on 26 April, 2022. Government of Estonia opened its Embassy in New Delhi headed by a Cd'A in February 2012. The first resident Ambassador presented his credentials on 22 February, 2013.
